2008 4-H Scholarships

The following four scholarships are available to 4-H members through MB 4-H Council

- Must submit a 4-H scholarship application (see following)
- No interviews required, Paper selection only.
- All information is expected to be complete to process the application.
- You are not eligible to win the same scholarship twice
- You shall not receive more than one of the scholarships listed on this application in the same year.

Applications MUST be postmarked to the Brandon Office no later than Thursday, March 20, 2008 Incomplete applications (i.e. name missing from pages, late postmarked, or missing criteria) will be disqualified.

What grading system is used by Manitoba 4-H Council to select the scholarship winners? (This criteria pertains to the Manitoba 4-H Council; Canadian Wheat Board; Western Producer; and Bayer CropScience Scholarships only. Other scholarships are graded independently.)
4-H involvement 20%, Essay (if applicable) 25%, Extra Curricular Participation 15%, School Grades 15%, Personal Information 10%, References 5%, Career Plans 5%, Employment 5%

⇒ CANADIAN WHEAT BOARD SCHOLARSHIP

One \$1000 award to be used towards obtaining a degree in the faculties of Agricultural and Food Sciences or Human Ecology.

Eligibility

- must be 16 years of age as of January 1, 2008.
- must have been a 4-H member for at least two years and have been registered in 4-H within the last 2 years (2006/2007 or later)

WESTERN PRODUCER SCHOLARSHIP

One \$1000 award to a student of a Diploma or Degree program related to agriculture, agribusiness or the rural economy of Manitoba at any officially recognized Canadian Post Secondary Institution **Eligibility**

- must be 16 years of age as of January 1, 2008.
- must have been registered as a Manitoba 4-H member for at least 3 years and have been registered as a member within the last 3 years (2005/2006 or later)
- Based on applicants' academic history, involvement in community, goals and ambition as well as direct involvement and experience with Manitoba 4-H.

→ MANITOBA 4-H COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIPS

Ten \$500.00 awards towards post-secondary education. These scholarships are made possible from funds generated from the MB 4-H Endowment Fund Foundation.

Eligibility

- must be 16 years of age as of January 1, 2008
- must have been a 4-H member for at least two years & must achieve in the year applying ('07/'08).
- must submit a 250-500 word essay on one of the following topics:

"NEW DIRECTIONS FOR 4-H PROJECTS"

Ensuring Youth Development from Project work through to Achievements

UPDATE

Over 65 members and leaders interviewed about 4-H projects . . .

Seven randomly selected members & leaders from each Area were interviewed (Dec – Jan) about the strengths of current 4-H project materials, how they use technology in 4-H project work, the best way to provide 4-H project materials and three wishes they would have for 4-H project materials.

People interviewed said they:

- appreciated the information provided in projects and the choices available for project topics
- use technology to do research for additional project information
- see opportunities for leader support, website listings, and some project completion on-line
- would appreciate choice in the way project materials are offered (e.g. paper, CD, online)
- feel that new and innovative projects and materials are important in both recruiting and maintaining members

Two day workshop with 4-H stakeholders . . .

A dynamic workshop in January saw 24 people of diverse backgrounds and opinions brainstorming exciting ideas for what 4-H projects could look like in the future. 4-H experts (leaders & members), youth development experts, activity based learning experts, Manitoba 4-H Council representatives and MAFRI staff shared experiences and knowledge. A working group will take the ideas and suggestions to further develop the templates.

What will happen to the current projects?

The implementation will occur over a 2 year period with a combination of adapting current project material & developing new material. Current project materials will be

available (until stocks run out) but will not be reprinted until the topic is redeveloped in the new format. There is a foundation of solid project content. Improving consistency will help ensure the desired content & concepts are taught in age appropriate ways.


