
Project Manuals on the Web!

YBF Directors, Manitoba 4-H Council, and Manitoba Agriculture, Food and Rural Initiatives are looking forward to continuing with the Home Stay Program. The program promotes cultural awareness and personal development in our young people as well as fosters a good understanding and strengthens business and agricultural ties between Manitoba and Japan. Over 262 Manitoba 4-H Families have broadened their cultural knowledge by forming friendships with Japanese Students over the years. Through this program, 170 Manitoba 4-H'ers have had travel experiences to Japan. Lifelong friendships have evolved through the program. Manitoba 4-H members have been invited to travel to Japan again in 2011. Eligible host families will be sent information directly.

This summer Manitoba 4-H families will have the opportunity to welcome 20 Japanese students and two teachers into their homes from July 29-Aug 12, 2011. Interested in hosting? Check out the details below!

4-H HOST FAMILIES NEEDED!

Japanese Youth Visit

2011 will mark the 24th year of this exchange program sponsored by The YBF in Japan. The 20 students (approximate ages 16-18) and 2 chaperones will be in host family homes from July 29-Aug. 12, 2011. All host families will attend an evening orientation prior to the visit and families are invited to a welcome luncheon and a farewell barbecue with their Japanese participants.

What is hosting about?

By welcoming an out of country delegate into your home your family will learn more about the lifestyle and culture of another country. Being a host family need not be expensive or change your regular family routine. The purpose is to give delegates the opportunity to experience everyday life in another part of the world and to treat them as part of your family. Host families may want to plan some special activities for their visitors and take them to local places of interest. Seeing combining, horseback riding, campfires and star gazing are common highlights mentioned by the Japanese students. To be a host family this coming year, complete this application and return it as soon as possible. Details below:

2011 4-H Scholarships

The following scholarships are available to 4-H members through MB 4-H Council

- . No interviews required. Paper adjudication only.
- Members are not eligible to win the same scholarship twice.
- Applicants can receive only one of the scholarships listed on this application in the same year.
- Incomplete applications (i.e. name missing from pages, late postmarked, or missing criteria) will be disqualified.

Applications MUST be postmarked to the Brandon Office no later than Thursday, March 17, 2011.

What grading system is used by Manitoba 4-H Council to select the scholarship winners?

(This criteria applies to the Manitoba 4-H Council, Canadian Wheat Board, Western Producer, Bayer Crop Science Scholarships and John and Ona Schellenburg Bursary)

4-H involvement 20%, Essay (if applicable) 25%, Extra Curricular Participation 15%, School Grades 15%, Personal Information 10%, References 5%, Career Plans 5%, Employment 5%

⇒ CANADIAN WHEAT BOARD SCHOLARSHIP

One \$1,000 award to be used towards obtaining a degree in the faculties of Agricultural and Food Sciences or Human Ecology.

Eligibility

- must be 16 years of age as of January 1, 2011.
- must have been a 4-H member for at least two years and have been registered in 4-H within the last two years (2009/2010 club year or later)

▶ WESTERN PRODUCER SCHOLARSHIP

One \$1,000 award to a student of a Diploma or Degree program related to agriculture, agribusiness or the rural economy of Manitoba at any officially recognized Canadian Post Secondary Institution

Eligibility

- Must be at least 16 years of age as of January 1, 2011.
- Must have been registered as a Manitoba 4-H member for at least 3 years and have been registered as a member within the last 3 years. (2008/2009 or later).

▶ BAYER CROPSCIENCE 4-H SCHOLARSHIP

One \$500 award for 4-H members used toward either a degree or diploma in Agriculture, Agribusiness or Sciences. **Eligibility**

- must be 16 years of age as of January 1, 2011.
- must have been a 4-H member for at least two years and have been registered in 4-H within the last two years (2009/2010 or later).

▶ MANITOBA 4-H COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIPS

Six \$1,000 awards towards post-secondary education. These scholarships are made possible from funds generated from the MB 4-H Endowment Fund Foundation.

Eligibility

- must be 16 years of age as of January 1, 2011.
- must have been a 4-H member for at least two years.
- Must achieve in the year applying ('10/'11).
- must submit a 250-500 word essay on one of the following topics:
 - 1. Quality People: How will the character traits developed by the 4-H program help me in my future?
 - 2. Quality Experiences: What quality experiences in the 4-H program have kept me involved in 4-H projects?
 - 3. Quality Projects: What makes a quality 4-H program?

⇒ JOHN AND ONA SCHELLENBURG BURSARY

One \$500 award to a student pursuing a post secondary education in Agriculture or Veterinary Medicine at a Manitoba Post Secondary institution.






