The top two placings in the Steer Carcass Competition held earlier this year were Walker McAuley of the Gainsborough Combined 4-H Club with Kiernan Olson from the MacGregor Mix 'N Match Club in 2<sup>nd</sup> place. The 2012 Rate of Gain Award went to Austin Little of the Portage Beef Club whose steer gained 3.34 lbs/ day. Other honourable mentions were Riley Trimble and Cindy Jack whose steers both gained 3.14 lbs/day.




