Welcome everyone to the 2016-17 4-H year and thank you for your commitment to, and participation in, Canada's leading positive youth development organization.

1) Transfer of Roles

As you will have already heard, the Manitoba 4-H Council is assuming a greater responsibility for the administration of the provincial 4-H program from the Department of Agriculture. Council welcomes this opportunity to have a much larger role in the management of the program and has been preparing for this transition since 2014.

2) Brand Consistency Builds Strength

A reminder to clubs who may be ordering new uniforms or club promotional material that you must follow the brand guidelines for the new logo launched in 2015.

3) Your Opinion Matters

"Share your Voice with 4-H Canada". All members are encouraged to complete the 4-H Impact on Youth Survey at www.4-h-canada.ca/impact-youth-4-h-survey to tell us "How has 4-H Shaped You?"

4) Complete your 4-H Project in a Weekend!

Will be offered again this fall, running concurrently with the Provincial Leaders' Conference from October 21-23 in Brandon.

5) Protecting Youth

The Youth Protection Program is important to ensure the safety of our members . A reminder that members aged 18 or older as of January 1 of the current 4-H year, must also complete their YPP. It is vital to the integrity of the program that screening is completed in a timely manner.

6) Easy Access to Information

In order to continue to provide up-to-date information to our 4-H families and leaders, Council re-launched our website again in May with a new look and format which is much more user-friendly. Please check it out at www.4h.mb.ca.

7) Fees Reflect Increased Value

As a continuance of the motion (September 2014) to increase fees by \$5 per year for 5 years, the annual enrolment fee to Manitoba 4-H Council Inc. for the 2016-17 4-H year will be \$65, effective September 1, 2016.

8) National Opportunities

Some opportunities for club funding, travel and scholarships will again be provided by 4-H Canada (www.4-h-canada.ca) this year so please watch eZines, Banners, website and other communications for details related to these programs.

Payment of this membership fee is mandatory in order to operate as a 4-H club and for 4-H members and leaders to be eligible for events, trips, scholarships and other opportunities.

A 4-H club must pay its Manitoba 4-H Council Membership Fee within 30 days of enrollment.

For the 2016-2017 4-H year, the membership fee is \$65.00 per member.

Note: a member who belongs to two or more 4-H clubs is only assessed one club fee.

2017 is the 30th Anniversary of the Homestay Program!!






