

In 2009, we are launching 8 new or revised project series! In the new Manitoba 4-H project framework, there is a member's manual and a leader's guide for each project and there are 3 levels of skill development in each project topic series.

Here's how it works:

Explore - each project series has one project outlining the basics. All beginning members will be expected to complete the Explore level project before moving into the Discover level projects. It introduces the

basic skills and terms needed by members for the following Discover and Master projects in that series.




options to practice specific techniques and gain skills through specialized builders. Member can take as many Discover level projects as they like through their 4-H career.

Master – once members have learned the basics by taking the Explore and at least 2 Discover projects in a series, multiple project options allow specialization in a topic. The Leader's role is to look for opportunities for their members to have more authentic experiences by: working with other mentors, partnering with outside agencies, participating in exchanges, entering competitions, etc.

National 4-H Citizenship Seminar

April 9 – 15, 2010 (to be confirmed) - Ottawa 8 Manitoba Member delegates travel to Ottawa to participate in workshops and hear speakers on the theme of being a Canadian. A great opportunity to look at citizenship issues and see the highlights of our Nation's Capital.

National 4-H Members Conference

November 3 – 7, 2010 – Toronto
7 Manitoba delegates travel to Toronto to share ideas and increase awareness of environmental and agricultural issues. The conference includes delegates from the U.S. and United Kingdom.




