# President's Message

Welcome everyone to the 2014-15 4-H year. In order to ensure the safest possible environment for our young people to learn and grow, all leaders in a position of trust, including those parents leading only their own children, must complete the Youth Protection Program (YPP) screening. This is important not only to maintain the integrity of YPP but, as a result of the many opportunities 4-H offers, there is always the potential to be responsible for children other than your own. Timely completion is vital as leaders who have not completed their screening (or re-screening) must be accompanied by a leader with a valid screening until such time as they receive their YPP acceptance letter. Also please remember that 4-H members must complete YPP on reaching the age of 18.

As part of an ongoing risk management review, we are pleased to introduce three new Codes of Conduct (Members, Registered Volunteers, and Non-registered Volunteers) as well as a Conflict Resolution Procedure. The documents, based on a standard of behaviour that is expected of all participants in the 4-H program, are self-explanatory and all 4-H groups are strongly encouraged to adopt these at the beginning of this 4-H year.

In order to build on the successes of last year, planning is well underway for the 2014 Provincial Leaders' Conference as well as the 2015 Intermediate Members' Event. We look forward to

seeing many of you at these.

After no change for three years, the Board voted to increase the Manitoba 4-H Council membership fee for the 2014-15 year to \$55 per member. We feel that the 4-H program still offers exceptional value.

# **2014 HIGHWAY CLEAN-UP**

# 2014-2015 Membership Fee – Manitoba 4-H Council

All 4-H clubs in Manitoba are members of Manitoba 4-H Council which, in turn, is a member of Canadian 4-H Council. Payment of this membership fee is mandatory in order to operate as a 4-H club and for 4-H members and leaders to be eligible for events, trips, scholarships and other opportunities. A 4-H club must pay its Manitoba 4-H Council Membership Fee within 30 days of enrollment. For the 2014 - 2015 4-H year, the membership fee is \$55.00 per member.

Note: A member who belongs to two or more 4-H clubs is only assessed one club fee.

Download **form** at <u>www.4h.mb.ca</u>, see Getting Started package or request from provincial office. Complete the form and return with cheque/money order payable to Manitoba 4-H Council.

A Tax Receipt form is available from Head Leaders towards the Children's Arts & Cultural Activity Manitoba tax credit. This will provide parents of children under 16 with a 10.8% non-refundable income tax credit on up to \$500 worth of eligible expenses for participation in eligible non-fitness activities which include 4-H (worth up to \$54 per child in income tax savings)

**Attention Equine Project Members and Leaders** 

New Resources and Revised Project Material

There has been a change to the look of Exploring Horses 1-3. Acting on feedback from members and leaders, the Exploring Horses level has been changed.

New this fall – there will be three separate member manuals, one for each level of Exploring Horses. In addition there will be three corresponding leader's guides. Members and leaders for all three levels will also enjoy the new Exploring Horses Resource manual, with all the background information to help you work through the activities and dismounted skills.

New this fall is a twenty page resource for all equine leaders –"Where to Locate Information Required for the Dismounted Level Assessment Skills:

Levels 1- 6". This fact sheet cross references each of the dismounted skills required in Levels 1 to 6 (Exploring Horses 1-3, Discovering Horses 4 and 5 as well as Mastering Horses – Advanced Horsemanship) to the proper reference material for each project manual. Sometimes it has been hard to help members find the information they are looking for to complete project activities or successfully complete the required skills. This resource should make it much easier to find just the right page you need!

Does your club have a copy of the DVDs 4-H Horsemanship and Let's learn Anatomy? Ask your club head leader or check with your local MAFRD office to borrow. 4-H Horsemanship is an excellent resource for mounted and dismounted skills at all levels, while the Let's Learn Anatomy is particularly helpful with health and anatomy skill builders.



# Together We Will Make A Difference

Kenton 4-H Kraftsmen definition of citizenship is "Learning to Make a Difference in the Lives of Others." By making outstanding contributions to better our community without any expectation of reward is where our goal will start. We feel with hard work, a lot of volunteering and giving kindness to people in need our little club will make this happen.

All of our members have been very busy demonstrating good citizenship in many areas of community involvement.

On December 17<sup>th</sup> 2013 our club spent the day volunteering in Brandon, half of us were at the Samaritan House Christmas Store helping people in need shop for their families Christmas gifts, our other half went to the Samaritan House Central location and helped distribute food hampers, sort food and help homeless find warm clothing. It was a family of seven, this volunteer group provided this family with Christmas gifts and all the groceries to allow this family to have a beautiful Christmas din-

When they heard the 5 year old boy squeal, "This is just what I wanted," our group knew they had given this family a Christmas they would never forget!

The remaining money will be spent on fleece material to make tied blankets to donate to the Woman's Shelter. We will hand deliver these to the shelter so children arriving there will have something to comfort them.

Another big project our group takes part in is a senior buddy program which is in year two in our club and was originated by one of our senior members, Brooke Tolton. Through her summer job at Lilac and Park Resident in Hamiota she saw how much enjoyment young people could bring to the lives of seniors. So she has partnered 4-H members with a senior and they meet on a weekly basis. This program has been so beneficial to everyone!

As 4-H members we believe we have went above and beyond to prove the concept of good citizenship in our school and community because we have MADE A DIFFERENCE in the lives of others and we will continue with this commitment!



# The CANADA-WIDE 4-H Agriventure \$3,000 Scholarship Apply by November 1, 2014

AgriVenture is a terrific way to spend a "gap year" living and working in another country and culture. Applicants can choose a placement in Denmark, France, Germany, Netherlands, Norway, Sweden, United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand or Japan. Many young people use AgriVenture as a way to gain practical experience to aid them in their agricultural or horticultural studies.

The 4-H AgriVenture Scholarship invites past and present 4-H members from all across Canada to apply for the \$3,000 Scholarship towards participation in an AgriVenture international exchange program. This program is open to participants who are between the ages of 18 and 30 at the time of travel, who have been 4-H members for at least two years. The Scholarship will be applied towards an AgriVenture program of any length to the recipient's choice of host country. The deadline for the Scholarship application is November 1, 2014 and must be submitted to the Manitoba 4-H Council office by that date. 



If cancellation is less than 21 days, the delegate will forfeit the registration fee. Policy 3-01-08.
