## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Happy New Year to our 4-H families, leaders and friends! The beginning of another year is always an exciting time. As we try to stick to the New Year Resolutions we all make each year, we at Manitoba 4-H Council are focused on only one – the Resolution brought forward in 2013 to change our Board structure from a Representational Board to a Policy Board. While overseeing the organization to ensure it is well-managed, a Policy Board gives direction to the Executive Director but allows the staff to accomplish the job as they see fit.

At present, we have two Boards, the larger Advisory Board (27 people) and the Executive Board (11 Directors from the Advisory Board plus M4HC staff) which is our legal entity. The single new Board will be comprised of nine elected Directors (6 Adult and 3 Youth) and one appointed Director, plus the Executive Director, Office Manager and MAFRD Representative who are non-voting members. In addition, a Consultation Group (including interested parties from Area and club levels) will meet annually or as required.

At the AGM in November 2015, this new governance structure, developed over the past 18 months, will come into effect. This will mean that, at that time, each Area Council will no longer be represented by a Junior and Senior Director. Instead, early this January, Nomination Papers will be mailed to all 4-H households and you will have the opportunity to nominate potential Directors to fill six vacancies three Adult Directors and three Youth Directors. In order to maintain some continuity during the transition, the three remaining positions will be filled by the incoming President and two ongoing Adult Directors. Once Nominations have been received, each club, Area Council and current Board Director will be eligible to vote in the election for incoming Directors.

Rather than long running Committees, Task Groups will be formed to handle all events and special projects of Council and participation is encouraged by all 4-H parties – members, leaders, parents, alumni and partners. Full details of the election process and future structure of the Manitoba 4-H Council will be included in the Nomination Package, however if you have any questions, please don't hesitate to call the office on 204-726-6136.

#### 2014 Provincial Leaders Conference

Manitoba 4-H Council AGM and Provincial Leaders Conference was held November 15-16th in Brandon. 62 leaders, Sr. members and board members participated in the weekend events.

A highlight for many was Keynote Speaker, John Drummond of 4-H Ontario. John, who was the 2013 National 4-H Leader of the Year, spoke about his experiences leading non-traditional 4-H clubs (projects) including Market Kitchen and Paintball.



Conference delegates were also introduced to the new *LEGO(R) Mania!* resource and explored some of the LEGO(R) activities at the Conference banquet. The banquet speaker was Carson Rodgers, of the Sydney 4-H Beef Club who talked about his experience at the Global Youth Institute in Des Moines, Iowa in October.

# 2015 4-H Scholarships

Through Manitoba 4-H Council, the following scholarships are available to 4-H members who are at least 16 years of age as of January 1, 2015, except for the Future Leaders Club 4-H Scholarships.

- No interviews required. Paper adjudication only.
- Members are not eligible to win the same scholarship twice.
- Applicants can receive only one of the scholarships listed on this application in the same year
- Incomplete applications (i.e. name missing from pages, late postmarked, or missing criteria) will be disqualified.

Applications MUST be postmarked to the Brandon Office no later than Friday, February 27, 2015

#### What grading system is used by 4-H Manitoba Council to select the scholarship winners?

(This criteria applies to all scholarships)

4-H involvement 25%, Essay (if applicable) 20%, Extra Curricular Participation 15%, School Grades 15%, Personal Information 10%, References 5%, Career Plans 5%, Employment 5%

#### **⇒** WESTERN PRODUCER 4-H SCHOLARSHIP

One \$1,000 award to a student of a Diploma or Degree program related to agriculture, agribusiness or the rural economy of Manitoba at any officially recognized Canadian post secondary institution

 must have been registered as a 4-H Manitoba member for at least 3 years and have been registered as a member within the last 3 years. (2012/2013 or later).

#### **⇒** BAYER CROPSCIENCE 4-H SCHOLARSHIP

One \$1,000 award for 4-H members used towards either a degree or diploma in Agriculture, Agribusiness or Sciences.

 must have been a 4-H member for at least two years and have been registered in 4-H within the last two years (2013/2014 or later).

#### **▶** YORK BENIMARU FOUNDATION 4-H SCHOLARSHIP

One \$1,000 award to a 4-H member towards post-secondary education or an education based travel opportunity through a recognized program

- must have hosted through the Manitoba 4-H/YBF Homestay program
- preference will be given to members who have not previously travelled to Japan
- must have been a 4-H member for at least 2 years and have been registered in 4-H within the last 3 years (2012/2013 or later)
- must submit a 250-500 word article on the benefits of hosting an international student (with permission, the article may be used for promotional purposes).

#### **▶** MANITOBA 4-H COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIPS

Eight \$1,000 awards towards post-secondary education. These scholarships are made possible from funds generated from the MB 4-H Endowment Fund Foundation.

- must have been a 4-H member for at least two years.
- must achieve in the year applying (2014/2015).
- must submit a 250-500 word essay on one of these topics:
  - People: How will the character traits developed by the 4-H program help me in my future?
  - 2. Experiences: What experiences have kept me involved in the 4-H program?
  - 3. Projects: What makes a quality 4-H project? Which projects have kept me involved?

#### JOHN AND ONA SCHELLENBURG 4-H BURSARY

Four \$1,000 awards to students with financial need pursuing a post secondary education in Agriculture or Veterinary Medicine at a Manitoba post secondary institution.

- must have been a 4-H member for at least 2 years.
- must submit a short paragraph about financial need (eg. books, tuition, travel, accommodation).
