Welcome to the start of the 2015-16 4-H year. The refreshed official Canadian 4-H logo and Brand were launched at the Canadian 4-H Council AGM in June. This is the new standard for all promotion of the 4-H program across Canada. Information regarding use of the refreshed logo can be found at www.4-h-canada.ca/brand, including the club logo generator for 4-H clubs across the country to create and save their own personalized version of the new logo. Additionally, 4-H Canada has introduced a grant program for clubs, zones and Areas in order to support community level initiatives that proudly display the refreshed 4-H clover logo on branded materials. The new Manitoba 4-H Council website was also unveiled in June, under the same URL at www.4h.mb.ca. This site has a new look and functionality intended to promote the program to potential members and program partners, as well as provide the main conduit for information to members, leaders, parents, clubs and Area Councils. Going forward, communication regarding 4-H Manitoba events and programs will direct interested parties to the website for more detailed information. Clubs, Interclub Associations and Area Councils are strongly encouraged to provide Council with photos, videos, and event details so that we can make the new website the hub of promotion for the 4-H Manitoba program. The location and date for Provincial Communications Extravaganza have yet to be determined but the very popular Intermediate Camp is scheduled for Russell in April. Fun Fest is moving to the last weekend in June to be held in conjunction with the Red River Ex in Winnipeg. REMINDER— The Manitoba 4-H Board Structure is Changing!

The Manitoba 4-H Board structure will change from a Representational Board to a Policy Board at the AGM in November 2015. The single new Board will be comprised of nine elected Directors (6 Adult and 3 Youth) and one appointed Director, plus the Executive Director, Office Manager and MAFRD Representative who are non-voting members. In addition, a Consultation Group (including interested parties from Area and club levels) will meet annually or as required. While overseeing the organization to ensure it is well-managed, a Policy Board provides direction to the Executive Director but allows the staff to accomplish the job as they see fit.

In addition, Task Groups will be formed to handle all events and special projects of Council and participation is encouraged by all 4-H parties – members, leaders, parents, alumni and partners.

2015 HIGHWAY CLEAN-UP

Another Highway Clean-Up Campaign has come and gone and 36 of the 42 clubs that registered to participate in this very worthwhile effort were able to complete the task. In total, 821 4-H members, leaders, family and friends cleaned 424.9 kilometres of highway and filled 1,995 bags of garbage. That amounts to \$11,917 raised by our 4-H clubs.

Thank you sincerely to all the participants for their hard work and to the Department of Infrastructure and Transportation for continuing to offer this opportunity to us.

The Highway Clean-Up campaign increases environmental awareness in people of all ages and results in a cleaner Manitoba. Thank you all for the energy and effort you put into this program every year.

2015-2016 Membership Fee - Manitoba 4-H Council

All 4-H clubs in Manitoba are members of Manitoba 4-H Council which, in turn, is a member of Canadian 4-H Council. Payment of this membership fee is mandatory in order to operate as a 4-H club and for 4-H members and leaders to be eligible for events, trips, scholarships and other opportunities.

A 4-H club must pay its Manitoba 4-H Council Membership Fee within 30 days of enrollment. For the 2015 - 2016 4-H year, the membership fee is \$60.00 per member.

Note: A member who belongs to two or more 4-H clubs is only assessed one club fee.

Download *form* at www.4h.mb.ca, see Getting Started package or request from provincial office. Complete the form and return with cheque/money order payable to Manitoba 4-H Council.

A Tax Receipt form is available from Head Leaders towards the Children's Arts & Cultural Activity Manitoba tax credit.

This will provide parents of children under 16 with a 10.8% non-refundable income tax credit on up to \$500 worth of eligible expenses for participation in eligible non-fitness activities which include 4-H (worth up to \$54 per child in income tax savings)






