

My 4-H Story: I joined 4-H when our family moved to McCreary. In fact not only did I join but so did my 2 sisters and my mother who served as our 4-H leader. Our club was very active, offering many fabulous experiences to those who wanted to participate. Through the years as a member of McCreary 4-H Busy Hands, I participated in events such as public speaking competitions, summer camps, rallies, junior conferences and exchange trips. I can honestly say that not only these events but also the people I met at these events helped shape the person I have become.

While in high school, I had summer jobs with the Department of Agriculture which introduced me to Dept. of Agriculture staff. Influenced by those connections, I entered the Faculty of Agriculture, again working every summer with the department, during which I had the opportunity to work on many 4-H events, rallies, cattle shows, fairs and camps.

Following graduation, my first full time job was as the 4-H specialist in Eastern Manitoba. I then moved on to become the Chief of Manitoba's 4-H Program.
