#### An Update from Council

Welcome everyone to the 2017-18 4-H year and thank you for your commitment to, and participation in, Canada's leading positive youth development organization.

#### 1) Transfer of Roles

We are now one full year into the transfer of 4-H Manitoba administrative responsibilities to the Council and, on behalf of the Board and staff, we would like to thank all leaders, members and families for their patience and cooperation in making this transition as seamless as possible. Manitoba 4-H Council continues to be your main contact point for club, member and leader support, Area Council program support, member and leader database and volunteer screening (the Youth Protection Program).

#### 2) Brand Consistency Builds Strength

A reminder to clubs who may be ordering new uniforms or club promotional material that you must follow the brand guidelines for the new logo launched in 2015.

#### 3) Complete your 4-H Project in a Weekend!

Following the successful formula for the past two years, the Senior members' event will again run concurrently with the Provincial Leaders Conference from October 20-22 in Brandon.

#### 4) 4-H Art Challenge

As part of 4-H Manitoba's contribution to the celebration of Canada 150, Council initiated a province-wide art contest. A number of regional

competitions have been completed but two opportunities still remain for clubs to compete, one in The Pas on September 30 and one in Roland on October 7.

#### 5) 4-H Food Challenge

After a successful province-wide pilot in 2017, this contest will be held again this 4-H year at various regional locations across Manitoba, with winners to advance to provincial finals in June 2018.

#### 6) Protecting Youth

The Youth Protection Program is important to ensure the safety of our members. Please remember that members aged 18 or older as of January 1 of the current 4-H year must also complete their YPP. It is vital to the integrity of the program that screening is completed in a timely manner.

#### 7) Easy Access to Information

#### 8) Fees Reflect Increased Value

As a continuance of the motion (September 2014) to increase fees by \$5 per year for 5 years, the annual enrolment fee to Manitoba 4-H Council Inc. for the 2017-18 4-H year will be \$70, effective September 1, 2017.

#### 2017-2018 Membership Fee – Manitoba 4-H Council Inc.

All 4-H clubs in Manitoba are members of Manitoba 4-H Council Inc. which, in turn, is a member of Canadian 4-H Council.

Payment of this membership fee is mandatory in order to operate as a 4-H club and for 4-H members and leaders to be eligible for events, trips, scholarships and other opportunities.

A 4-H club must pay its Manitoba 4-H Council Membership Fee within 30 days of enrollment.

For the 2017-2018 4-H year, the membership fee is \$70.00 per member.

**Note:** a member who belongs to two or more 4-H clubs is only assessed one club fee.

### For FALL: NEW BEEF and SMALL ANIMAL project series Coming in JANUARY: brand new addition to the FOODS Series.

#### **BEEF SERIES**



*Cloverbud Beef*: for members who are 6 to 8 years of age. Members are encouraged to use a calf born between January 1 and March 15 of the project year.

Explore Beef - Building Beef Skills: for members who are 8 to 9 years of age.

*Discover Beef 1 – Buying Into Beef*: for members who are 9 to 10 years of age. It expands on the topics of selecting, feeding, facilities, health, handling and judging which were presented in previous levels.

*Discover Beef 2 - Quality Beef From A Quality 4-H Project*: for 4-H members who are 10 to 11 years old. Topics include more about selecting, caring for, handling and housing their animal. Other topics will include carcass evaluation, judging, animal welfare and marketing.

*Discover Beef 3 - 4-H Beef Making the Grade:* for members who are 12 - 13 years of age. Topics will include the different breeds of beef, making rations for their calves, calving problems and other health concerns, manure management, animal welfare, ethics, carcass evaluation, markets and the consumer.

Master Beef 1 - "Meating" The Challenge of Raising Beef: for members who are 13 - 14 years of age. New topics will include alternative watering systems, environmental concerns, animal welfare and "gate to ate" information such as carcass evaluation, marketing, the consumer link and current beef issues.

Master Beef 2 - Pick Your Topic: for members 15 and older, this project offers lots of choice. In addition to advanced record keeping and ration development, members can choose their own focus. Think outside the boxpick any beef related topic to dive into! Have you wanted to shadow a vet, learn about artificial insemination, investigate backgrounding or holistic management? What about learning more about herd sire selection or expanding your knowledge of beef and the environment.



#### **SMALL ANIMAL SERIES**

Join PAWS to explore the new Small Animal Series - Want to learn more about small companion animals or small livestock animals? Then this is the project series for you! This series has 6 projects to choose from:

**EXPLORE SMALL ANIMALS** and **DISCOVER SMALL ANIMALS**: let you learn how to pick and take care of a small companion animal or small livestock animal. No animal is required.

**DISCOVER SMALL ANIMALS - TIME TO SPECIALIZE COMPANION ANIMAL**: choose from nine topics: aquarium fish, small birds, cats, amphibians, lizards, gerbils, hamsters, mice and rats, rabbits or snakes. There are more extensive resources available for canine and cavy projects.

**DISCOVER SMALL ANIMALS - TIME TO SPECIALIZE SMALL LIVESTOCK:** choose from four small animal species. You will be focusing on raising small animals that require a premises identification number such as poultry, rabbits for meat production, goats, or llamas.

**DISCOVER SHEEP (4-H Ontario)**: learn about health, nutrition, breeding, lambing, selection, housing, transportation, marketing and animal welfare. Showmanship and judging will be covered too.

MASTER SMALL ANIMALS - PICK-A-TOPIC: you pick any small animal related project that interests you, whether companion animal or small livestock. Keep in mind that you will need to find your own resource material and seek out mentors to help you.

- Camping









In July 2017, ten 4-H Members and two chaperones travelled to Japan




