## ABOUT 4-H

4-H is an international youth organization involving more than seven million members in 80 countries around the world.

4-H in Canada began in Roland, Manitoba in 1913 as a Boys & Girls club – a community-based organization dedicated to rural youth.

In 1952 the name was changed to 4-H. Today 4-H reaches farm, rural and urban youth, focusing on leadership, personal and skill development including citizenship, responsibility and independence.

## PURPOSE OF MANITOBA 4-H COUNCIL

Formed in 1951, the Manitoba 4-H Council coordinates 4-H programming throughout the province and provides participation in the policy-making process. Through a representative structure, the issues, needs and concerns of members, leaders and staff are assessed when decisions are made about 4-H programs in Manitoba. The Council administers specific provincial programs and manages funds solicited through 4-H club donations and sponsorship. The Council works closely with its partner, Manitoba Agriculture and Resource Development, in the development of individuals building rural communities.

The Manitoba 4-H Council operating procedures are based on its Constitution.

We appreciate the patience and kindness of our 4-H community as we navigated through the pandemic.

With in-person groups limited to small numbers in October, we were able to host our Senior Members' Event and Provincial Conference on smaller scales and had to shuffle locations due to different facility restrictions. In the end, each event was a success.

To accommodate the pandemic restrictions, we once again offered a diverse selection of virtual project series for our members. The continued commitment of our sponsors, both financially and by way of participation, has been key to our successes.

We are continually grateful for our relationship with Manitoba Agriculture. Their dedication to the 4-H program is exemplary and we appreciate the trust and value they have enlisted in us through administration of the Alexander Cherban Agriculture Industry Development Program and the Leaders of Tomorrow Scholarship Fund.

With the development of the Fund Development and Marketing Coordinator position, Kellie McCallum signed her contract in July, and began working on plans for our fundraising dinner in a casual capacity.

I am grateful for the opportunity to give back in this capacity, supporting staff in new events, and expanding our already successful events for our members, leaders and volunteers. ## NATIONAL YOUTH ADVISORY COMMITTEE (YAC) MEMBERS

I began my time with the Youth Advisory Committee by quickly involving myself with the Youth Advisory Committee Marketing and Communications Working Group and the 4-H Canada Research and Data Committee.

As a member of the Marketing and Communications Working Group, I have been working towards representing the needs and interests of youth through brand initiatives and campaigns. With the Research and Data Committee, I have been working to gain demographic and experiential information about previous and current 4-H populations with initiatives like the 4-H Canada Alumni Survey.

My first event experienced with the Youth Advisory Committee was through the 2022 4-H Canada Science Fair. Having extensive science fair experience at that national level, I served as a mentor for finalists, a session emcee, and a presenter throughout the multi-day virtual event.

In April, all Youth Advisory Committee Representatives met for the first time, in a non-virtual setting, in Halifax for the 2022 4-H Canada Leadership Summit. We were able to aid in the successful delivery of the first in-person Leadership Summit since the COVID-19 pandemic began by moderating panel sessions, emceeding workshops, and contributing where necessary to ensure the conference was memorable and high-impact!

Throughout summer months, I was able to review applications for the John Deere Canada 4-H and Canadian Co-operative Wool Growers 4-H Scholarships. I also authored multiple Science and Technology Pillar articles for the upcoming issue of the 4-H Advantage.

Nearly a year into my term, I have experienced so many superlative opportunities, and many more are on the way including the facilitation of the 2022 4-H Canada Senior Members Forum and the production of 4 Minutes with 4-H episodes. Additionally, my time spent in this role has further developed my skills and qualities in collaboration, governance, responsibility, leadership and advocacy.

## MANITOBA AGRICULTURE AND RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT PARTNERSHIP

The Province of Manitoba through the Department of Agriculture has a strong and vibrant relationship with Manitoba 4-H Council, accomplishing shared goals in positive youth development. An annual grant provides for program development and delivery, and a staff liaison to the Manitoba 4-H Council board of directors ensures a communication link. Department staff in various branches provide technical knowledge and support in the areas of agriculture and environment, public trust, board development and leadership capacity building. This occurs at local and provincial levels in the form of strategy planning, presentations, workshops, resource development and consultation for program development.

The Leaders of Tomorrow 4-H Scholarship Fund, established in 2021, was a \$1 million investment by the Province in the Brandon Area Community Foundation. This fund, administered by Manitoba 4-H Council, has distributed scholarships to eight youth who are either current or former 4-H members. This fund will ensure a funding opportunity for 4-H members into the future for continuing education.

The Manitoba government launched the Alexander Cherban Agriculture Industry Development Program (ACAIDP) in 2020. The program was created to support innovative province-wide initiatives that increase public awareness about the importance of agriculture to the economy, building public trust for agriculture and processing or supporting agriculture skills development and promotion of agriculture related career opportunities. The program is capably administered by the Manitoba 4-H Council.

The Province highlighted the 4-H program through the annual proclamation of November as 4-H Month in Manitoba by the Honourable Ralph Eichler. As a founding member of the Canadian 4-H Council, Manitoba Agriculture maintains a membership in recognition of the importance of a national network and the success of 4-H in Canada.

Manitoba appreciates the leadership and success of Manitoba 4-H Council as an organization making important contributions to the future of a strong Manitoba.

## CELEBRATING 4-H WITH MANITOBA HOCKEY CLUBS

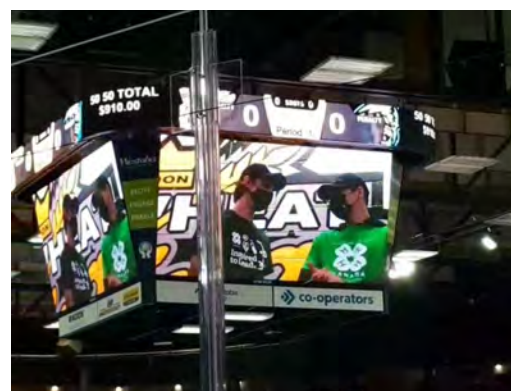

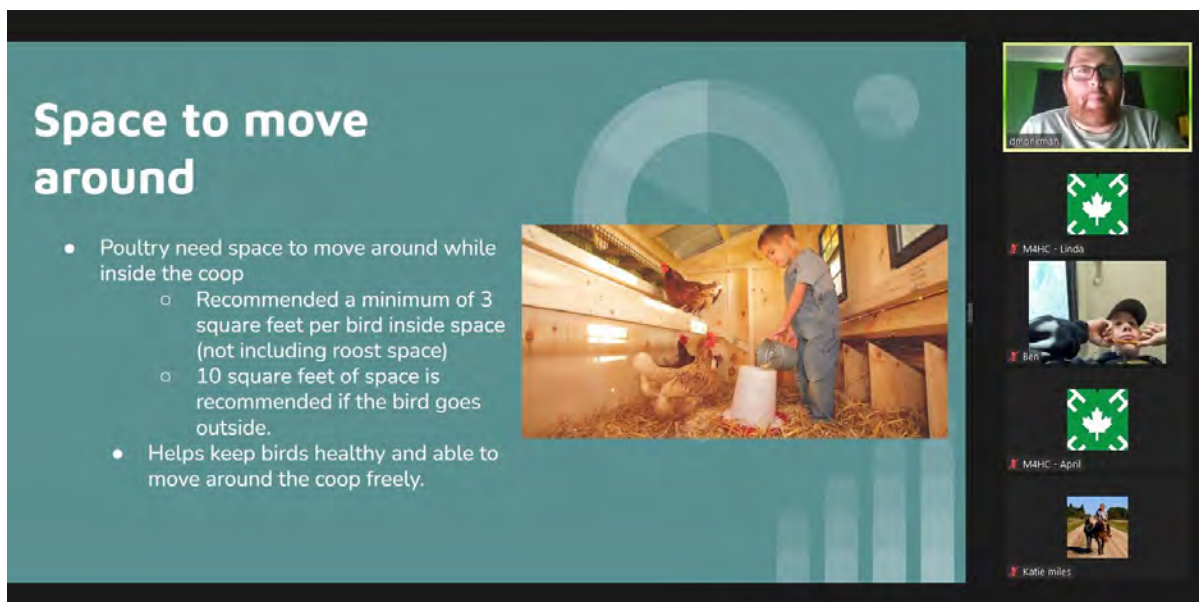

The day began at Manitoba Beef & Forage Initiatives Johnson Farm with Carcass Ultrasound from Shari Leachman of UltraBeef Ultrasound Services. We then moved on to a Low-Stress Cattle Handling workshop with Research Technician Leah Rodvang and summer student Josie Pedersen. 4-H Manitoba Leader Amanda Hamilton-Seward shared her knowledge of Cattle Judging and the members placed the class of four heifers.

We travelled to MBFI's Learning Centre at Brookdale. Lunch was provided by Heritage Co-Op and enjoyed by all. Dr. Everett More was in attendance to give a calving demonstration and discuss helpful techniques. Breaking into two groups allowed each group to join MBFI General Manager Mary-Jane Orr for a grasslands and animal nutrition workshop; Dr. More spent time with the members allowing them to calve Clover, the dystocia model cow.

The day was rounded out with prizes being awarded to our 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place winners in the heifer judging in Cloverbud, Junior, Intermediate and Senior age categories.

Amanda explained her reasons for her class placement and Manitoba 4-H Council Program Coordinator Linda McRae-Walker explained how she scored the judging cards and the written reasons.

All attendees delivered positive feedback and felt the information was useful and the day was well-put-together.

## INTERNATIONAL ART EXCHANGE

The 4-H International Art Exchange has blossomed into a four-way exchange between Canada (Manitoba), Poland (Warsaw), Taiwan (Taoyuan City), and the USA (Michigan) in which members paint or draw a picture that shows some aspect of their life.

The “visual letters” from Manitoba 4-Hers, aged 6-25, are collected and divided into packages that are mailed to the other three countries. In turn, they also send artwork packages to Canada. The artwork is displayed provincially and/or available for participating clubs to display/review.

In 2021-2022, 27 4-H Manitoba members from 11 clubs submitted creations for the art exchange, which helps participants gain a sense of being part of one world.

## GLOBAL YOUTH INSTITUTE (GYI)

For the past several years, Manitoba 4-H Council has partnered with Ag in the Classroom - Manitoba to award travel to two youth mentor teams to represent the province at the Global Youth Institute (GYI) in Des Moines, Iowa, USA.

In 2020, Kiera Johnston of the Graysville 4-H Light Horse & Pony Club and her mentor Scott Johnston, and Rizelle Pangilinan from Elmwood High School and her mentor Jenna Forslund, were not able to attend GYI due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

In 2021, due to COVID-19, the event took place online from October 18-22, and Kiera and Rizelle were invited to take part.

Kiera shared her experience with Manitoba 4-H Council: “To prepare for the event, every participant was required to research a developing country and prepare a report on solutions to their most pressing sustainability issues. I researched the country of Niger and explored how drip irrigation could become a solution to address their scarce water supply.

There was a variety of guest speakers who discussed many topics, including “Creating Good Food for All through the Next Generation,” “Exploring Challenges and Solutions,” and “Accelerating Women’s Access to Productive Resources to Produce More Food.”

I enjoyed learning about several sustainable ways that our current technologies can be advanced, to make more food available to countries in need. One of my favourite sessions throughout this event was learning about how Genetically Modified Organisms, or GMOs, are used to significantly increase food production.

One of my highlights was having the one-on-one opportunity to speak with Gebisa Ejeta, a former World Food Prize Laureate, who was born in Ethiopia. He told me about how he started in the agricultural field, as well as explained some of his previous work. He also told me about some of his hopes for future innovations. It was very inspiring to talk with one of the world leaders in agriculture and food science, as well as to hear his thoughts and recommendations for students looking to pursue a career in agriculture.

This was an amazing experience and an opportunity that I am grateful to have experienced. I learned a lot about a variety of topics while having my voice heard.

I would like to thank 4-H Manitoba and the many sponsors that helped give me this opportunity.”



## 4-H MANITOBA AREA COUNCILS

As expected, we started off our 2021-2022 4-H year with some COVID-19 restrictions which created challenges for some club and Area Council events. Several clubs chose to take the year off due to uncertainty with pandemic restrictions and vaccine requirements. Those clubs assured us they would resume once restrictions lifted and we saw some of them back in early spring.

As restrictions loosened throughout the year, Area Councils were able to hold some activities and meetings in person. Many areas chose to complete communications in person while some were held via Zoom. Beef and Equine shows were held in person with many members happy to be back in the show ring with their peers! Beef sales were a hybrid of in person and online, which was said to be a great way to get more buyers involved who couldn't attend the sales in person.

Our Club Support Coordinators continued their commitment to hosting 10 Youth Safety sessions throughout the winter of 2021-2022 via Zoom. The CSCs work hard to have all leaders complete their training, which allows us to maintain our accreditation with 4-H Canada.

## CLUBS AND AREA COUNCILS BENEFITTING FROM SOYBEAN FIELDS IN MANITOBA

4-H in Manitoba benefitted significantly once again from the fundraising opportunity coordinated by SeCan and offered to 4-H programs in Manitoba and Ontario.

The fundraising opportunity during the 4-H year actually began October 11-18, 2021 when producers across the two provinces were required to book certain varieties of SeCan soybean seed for the 2022 growing season. Following this booking period SeCan paid provincial 4-H programs \$1 for every unit of soybean seed reserved within their province during this campaign that ended up being sown in 2022. A significant portion of these funds is directed to clubs and Area Councils in Manitoba that were in close proximity to the location of the sales. In total, seven Area Councils and 51 4-H clubs benefitted from these funds, generated by the sales at 12 participating SeCan soybean seed retailers around the province. These funds are used to support a great variety of 4-H activities and initiatives, including sponsorship of provincial-level programming. Manitoba 4-H Council and our members and leaders who benefit from the 2021-22 Grow a Leader funding are grateful to SeCan, their supporting retailers and the farmers who purchased these varieties under the banner of the campaign.





## 4-H CANADA LEADERSHIP AWARDS

On February 23, 2022, Dawn Krinke was inducted as a 4-H Canada lifetime Honourary Member during 4-H Canada's virtual Leadership Awards ceremony. Dawn began working with Manitoba 4-H Council in November 2006 as a part-time Administrator and ended her career as Executive Director in December 2021. Among her career achievements were:

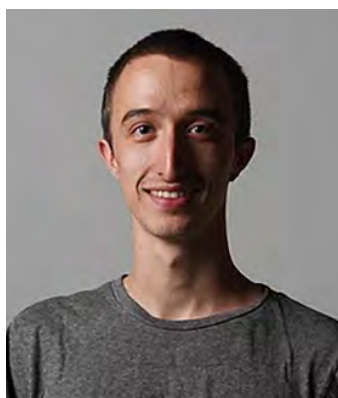
