
GOLD WATCH AWARD





- 2. To recognize and maintain the status of the 4-H Gold Watch Award, they will be awarded only in those years that a 4-H member is deemed a worthy recipient.
- 3. There may be one gold watch awarded within the Eastman Area.
- 4. To be eligible for the 4-H Gold Watch Award, a member must:
 - Be actively enrolled in the current 4-H year as a Senior or Adult Member and have both Eastman Area Council & MB 4-H Council Fees paid in full.
 - Have completed two or more years in 4-H club work. (These years need not be served in the same 4-H club or in consecutive order.)
 - Not have received a 4-H Gold Watch Award previously.
- 5. The selection of the Gold Watch Award winner is completed in the following manner:
 - 4-H Gold Watch Award application is open to ALL eligible 4-H members in the Eastman area.
 - Members apply by completing the application to the best of their ability.
 - Applications are submitted to the Eastman Council, by a deadline determined annually.
 - A selection team determines the most deserving recipient by reviewing the members' application forms.
 - An interview shall also be incorporated into the selection process. <u>OR</u> The member, in a hand written answer, may reply to 3 or 4 of the suggested interview questions and attach to their application.
 - It is important to note that only information included on the application and reference letter may be considered in making the decision. It is the members' responsibility to present all pertinent information about their 4-H careers.
 - It is recommended that the selections' team include a combination of three of the following:
 - a) a 4-H staff person
 - b) a senior member or leader currently or previously serving on Eastman 4-H Council
 - c) a past Gold Watch Award winner
 - d) a Gold Watch Award sponsor
 - e) a community leader
- 6. The Award recipient(s) will be presented with the Gold Watch award at an appropriate 4-H event.

If you could change one thing about your 4-H experience, what would it be and why?

What opportunities have you taken to use your 4-H acquired skills outside the program?

Describe a problem or difficult situation you have encountered and how you handled it.

What do you think has been your greatest accomplishment to date?

Once you've completed your years as a 4-H member, do you plan to remain involved in the program? How? Describe your favourite 4-H experience.
